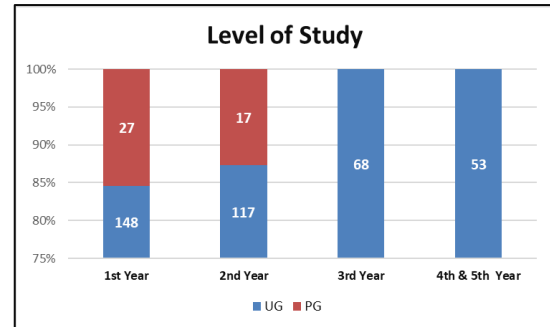
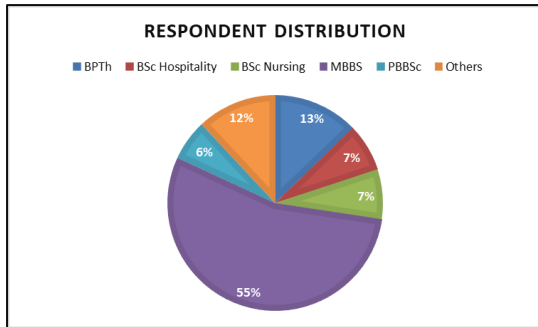


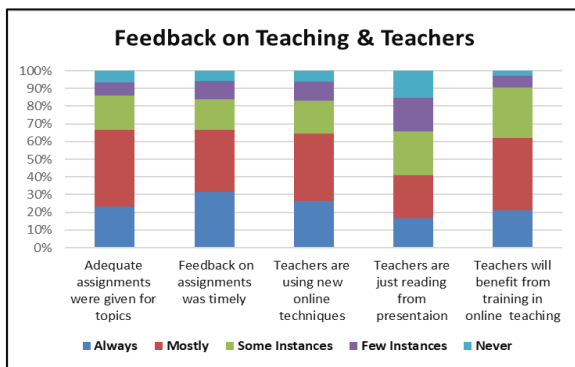
# Student Feedback on Online Teaching and Blended Learning

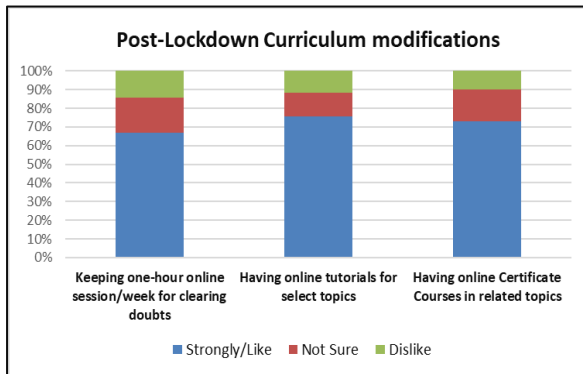
Total of 376 students responded to the feedback on online teaching in the University across all programs. Among respondents category 'Others' were students in various MSc programs.

**Action taken:** Students Councils were requested to encourage students to participate in the online feedback with the aim to improve delivery and design of curriculum.



Students reported in some programs that teachers were 'just reading' from presentations.

**Action taken:** Sub-analysis of data identified the programs and steps to rectify the same were taken with teacher training and counselling measures.



Majority of students favored continued online modality for clearing doubts and tutorials for select topics. Online certificate courses in related topics was also favored by over 70% of students after the lockdown period.

**Action Taken:** Proposed to design some purely online modules for certification and present them to Academic Council for approval. Two university faculty are preparing first two such modules.

Majority students were in favour of blended learning efforts after the lockdown. However, surprisingly the students were less certain of the support of their classmates.

**Action Taken:** Medical Education Unit has been apprised of this and requested to take suitable steps to implement blending learning wherever possible.
