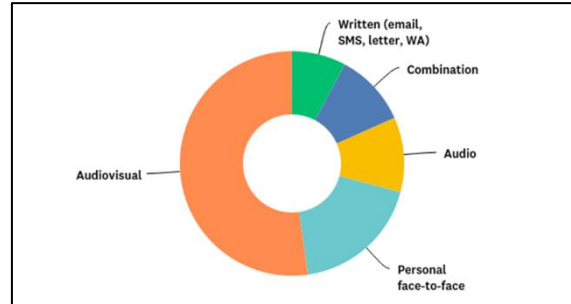
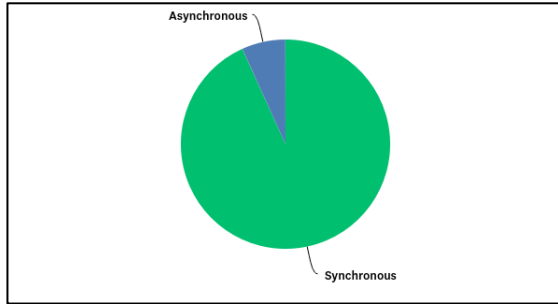
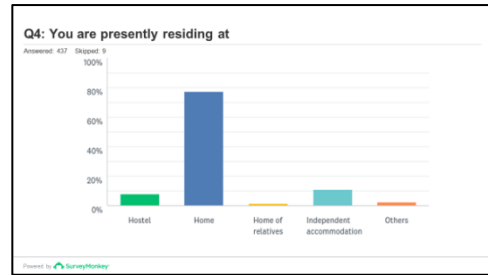


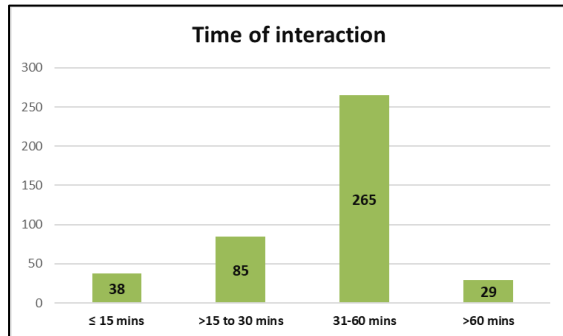
MENTEE FEEDBACK ON MENTOR-MENTEE MEETINGS UNIVERSITY MORAL GUIDANCE SCHEME [UMGS] 2019-2020

Feedback of 446 students was taken on the mentor-mentee interaction under the University Moral Guidance Scheme during the atypical period of the lockdown following COVID 19 Pandemic.

Majority students (>80%) were residing at home. 85.9% students agreed that the meeting was set in advance with 86.75% in accord that the meeting was mutually set at convenient time. Only 5 students claimed that the meeting was inconvenient to them.



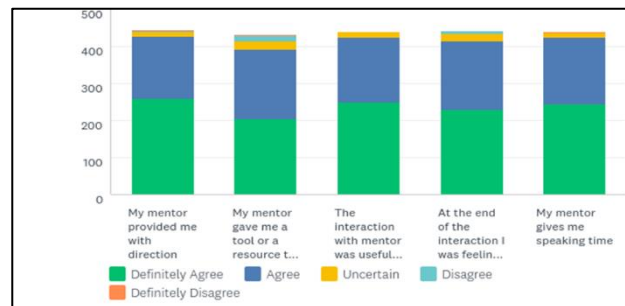
Mode of Meeting for majority of students was Synchronous with different modalities used by the faculty.



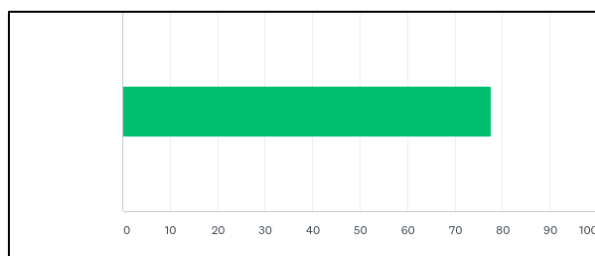
Mean time of the mentor-mentee interaction was 51.99 minutes in the context of group mentoring of majority.

Action Taken: Faculty who conducted routine mentoring over 60 minutes were reminded that mentoring of students with serious challenges/matters of concern should be individual sessions.

Majority of mentees agreed that the sessions were useful and provided them with direction, resources/tools to improve and ended with the mentee feeling good about themselves.



92.4% mentees reported that their Mentors have given speaking time to the mentees.



Mentees were asked to rate their overall relationship with their mentors on a scale of 1-100 with following labels: 0= I want a change in mentor; 50 = satisfactory; 100 = would like to continue relationship after graduation.

The mean rating was 77.59 with 58.2% giving a rating over 80/100 and 11.1% giving a rating below 50.

Overall Relationship with Mentor

Action Taken: IQAC has planned for a phase-wise refresher training of UMGS mentors in view of this report with the help of the Psychologist in the Counselling Cell. This will be conducted after the lockdown is over.

The interaction ended with 66.07% mentees agreeing that the date for the next mentor-mentee interaction was either set or discussed.

Action Taken: Mentors were communicated that scheduling a UMGS meeting should be done in consultation with mentees and must be brought up at the end of every mentor-mentee meeting.
