- Conducts research to improve nursing practices and patient care.

b. Research Assistant

- Works in public health studies or pharmaceutical trials.

6. Government and Public Sector Jobs

a. Government Hospitals (AIIMS, ESIC, etc.)

- Recruit through exams like NORCET, PSC, etc.

b. Military Nursing Services (MNS)

- Serve as nurses in the armed forces.

c. Community Health Nurse

- Works in rural and urban health initiatives.
