Quality in higher education is a multi-dimensional, multi-level, and dynamic concept that should embrace all its functions and activities, within and outside the traditional campus. Quality must reflect in all spheres, be it the institutional mission, aims & objectives, educational models, systems, programmes, policies and procedures. Quality thus may have different meanings depending on:

- . The understanding of different groups or stakeholders.
- The frame of reference: inputs, process, output, missions, aims, etc.
- Attributes or features of the academic world that must be evaluated.
- The historical periods of higher education development.

Quality Mandate:

At the behest of the Ministry of Education, then MHRD, the UGC has adopted Quality Mandate (QM) in 2018 to improve the quality in higher education. It is imperative for every higher educational institution (HEI) in the country to strive to meet the QM objectives.

Quality Mandate Objectives

Improve the graduate outcomes for the students, so that at least 50 per cent of them get access to employment/self-employment or engage themselves in the aim of higher education.

Encourage the link of the students with the society/industry such that at least two-third of the students are involved in socially-productive activities during their period of study in HEIs.

Educate students in crucial professional and life skills such as effective communication, leadership and social skills; instill professional ethics, universal human values, the spirit of innovation/entrepreneurship and critical thinking among the students and promote avenues for the display of these talents.

Ascertain that teacher vacancies, at any point of time, do not exceed 10 per cent of the sanctioned strength; and 100 per cent of the teachers are trained in the latest and emerging trends in their respective subject domains, and the pedagogies that translate their knowledge to the students.

Every HEI gets accreditation with a minimum score of 2.5 by 2022 from the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC).

Every university and higher educational institution must reinvent, grow and evolve to ensure these objectives are met. The matter of importance is how these will be achieved.

Quality Indicators

Emerging technology, changing social demographics and shifting needs of industry have been mirrored in the programs, courses and pedagogy in higher education. These changes necessarily finds expression in the indicators used to assess quality in these institutions. The determinants that define and quantify quality must also echo the existing state of education and the nation's economic and social realities.

Addressing this, the NEP 2020 provides a fitting document to bridge the distance between existing system of education and aspirational standards essential to meet the needs of India's growing economy.

Seminar Objectives

The seminar shall focus on various emerging quality perspectives in higher education, so as to crystalize the understanding on appropriate tools and techniques for realizing the objectives of the National Education Policy-2020 as well as the Quality Mandate of the UGC.

It would also attempt to throw light on the needed quality initiatives to make the Higher Education Sector more innovative, responsive, flexible and vibrant.

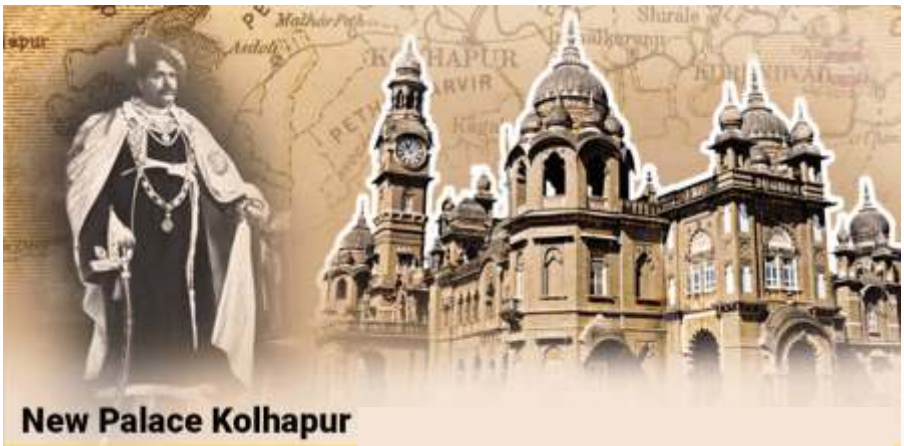
